Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. <ul> <li>First Bank does not share with our affiliates.</li> </ul>
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. <ul> <li>We do not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.</li> </ul>
Joint marketing	<ul> <li>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</li> <li>Our joint marketing partners include credit card, brokerage, and insurance companies.</li> </ul>

## Other important information

California Residents - We do not share your information with nonaffiliated third parties, except as permitted by law, such as for our everyday business purposes (such as servicing your account), to assist us in marketing our products and services to you, or with your consent. We do not share your information with our joint marketing partners. We limit sharing of your information with our affiliates to the extent require by California law.
